

## Pupil Premium Grant expenditure: Report to Parents: September 2014-15

Pupil premium grant is additional to main school funding. It is a government initiative to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

The pupil premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools and academies to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM'). Funding is also received for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, and children of service personnel.

The tables below show the distribution of pupil grant funding and the way in which it will be used to enrich the curriculum, provide opportunities and raise standards.
