

## Text Type

### Poetry - Poems on a Theme

<b>Purpose</b>	To write a poem on the given theme
<b>Poetic Form</b>	<b>Imagery:</b> simile, metaphor, personification.
<b>Organisational Features</b>	Verse, stanza, chorus

<b>Vocabulary</b>	Powerful nouns, verbs, adjectives, invented words and unusual word combinations.
<b>Sound Effects</b>	Alliteration, assonance (repetition of the same vowel phoneme in the middle of a word, especially where rhyme is absent: cool/food) onomatopoeia (where the sound of a word suggests its meaning: hiss, splutter).

### Structure of Text

<b>Title</b>	The title of the poem is linked to the theme. (NPD 2014: 'Remember')
<b>Identifying Rhythm</b>	There is a clear rhythm to the poem and the structure can be identified
<b>Use of Rhyme</b>	Accurate use of rhyme is used and adds to the poem
<b>Effectiveness when read aloud</b>	The word choices/structure of the poem make it effective when read aloud
<b>Consistency of Theme</b>	The theme of the poem runs consistently through each verse
<b>Use of verses/stanza</b>	The poem is written in verses that can be easily read aloud
