

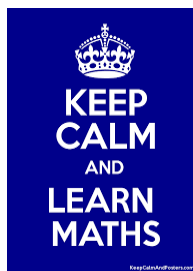

Scarlet Fever Information

Over the past fortnight we have had children and staff ill with various ailments. We have recently read in the news that there have been concerns with regards to Scarlet Fever. If you suspect your child has Scarlet Fever this is the advice you need to follow:

Symptoms? — Often starts with a sore throat, high fever, swollen glands and tonsillitis. A skin rash develops on the body, and the face is often flushed.

How does it spread? - By coughs and sneezes.

How to prevent it? - Children need to be treated with antibiotics. After 24 hours of treatment they will no longer be infectious.

Should Children be in school? - Children should stay away from school until 24 hours after the antibiotic treatment
