WHY IS IT IMPORTANT FOR YOUR CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL?

All parents want their children to get on well in life. Nowadays, it is more important than ever to have a good education behind you if you want opportunities in adult life. Children only get one chance at school, and your child's chances of a successful future may be affected by not attending school regularly.

DID YOU KNOW: An average attendance of 80% or less across a child's school career adds up to missing a whole 2 years from school.

BEING LATE FOR SCHOOL ALSO REDUCES VALUABLE LEARNING TIME!

If your child is 5 minutes late every day they will miss three days of learning each year. If your child is 15 minutes late every day they will miss 2 weeks of learning each year. Arriving late at school can be very disruptive for your child, the teacher, and the other children in the class.

So parents, can we ask that your child attends school regularly and on time every day. As we really want our children to have the best opportunities they can have whilst at school. If your child is ill or absent for any other reason please contact the school on the first day of absence.
