At Wentworth C of E Junior and Infant School, we believe PE and Sport plays a critical role in educating the whole child. PE contributes directly to the development of physical competence and fitness. It also helps children to make an informed choices and understand the value of leading a physically active life.

Sports Premium Money Allocation

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding for 2 years to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing and delivering high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all young people.

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013)

We have also promoted our Healthy Schools work throughout the year, encouraging children to walk to school whilst also promoting this through programmes such as the '10 day Active Challenge'. We promote after-school clubs and give children the option of fruit and milk whilst in school. Children are also encouraged to take part in games and activities during play times and lunch times where equipment is also available. Additional sports are also provided in school, such Bike Ability training and Archery lessons.
